• donor reactions	• RBCs stored in AS-1; hematocrit
• donor reactions; long term effects of donation; iron deficiency anemia	• recombinant factor VIIa; FDA approved indications

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• donor reactions; vasovagal	• repeat ABO typing, outside blood
• donor testing; repeatedly reactive infectious disease tests	• Rh (D) mother; weak D infant; management
• drug induced immune hemolytic anemia	• Rh IG infusion in ITP; hemoglobin concentration
• eluate Rh reactivity	• selection of compatible units
• emergency transfusion; adverse reaction	• serum neutralization with Le(a) and Le(b)
• emergency transfusion; Rh incompatible	• sickle cell disease crisis; treatment
• febrile transfusion reaction; premedication	• sickle cell disease; hyperhemolytic syndrome
• fetal-maternal transfusion; RBC incompatibility	• solvent-detergent viral inactivation
• FFP storage	• therapeutic apheresis for drug removal; pharmacokinetics
• FFP; indications	• therapeutic apheresis; acute graft versus host disease

• hemolytic disease of the fetus/newborn; Doppler ultrasound	• transfusion induced iron overload; chelation therapy

• hemolytic disease of the fetus/newborn; not Rh; not ABO	• transfusion trigger; coronary artery disease
• hemolytic transfusion reaction; passive antibodies	• transfusion-associated circulatory overload

• hydrops fetalis; alloantibodies	• unexpected antibody screening cells; reagent Rh phenotypes
• hypoproliferative thrombocytopenia; GI bleeding	• universal leukocyte reduction; impact
• incompatible crossmatch; emergency transfusion	• urgent warfarin reversal
• indications for irradiation of blood components	• West Nile Virus; NAT testing
• individual classified as Rh positive donor/Rh negative recipient
